CASE SUMMARY

We explored the case of a 17yo transitioning male whose overall anxiety is improving as he is taking control of his own care, including hormone therapy.

KEY QUESTION(S)

- How to support and educate myself and patient now that he is going forward with hormone therapy?
- How can I support him in completing school, finding the right counselor, procuring a driver's license and transportation?

CLARIFYING QUESTIONS	
Is the mother using preferred pronouns?	Yes, she is (but sometimes this is as far as she goes – limited involvement to support in appointments)
Is the patient on track to graduate?	Unsure, he currently only has 2-3 classes, and has had to drop some classes because attendance was so bad. Plan to reach out to the school to ask.
Does he have any contacts or peers, anyone he is close to that also connects to the LGBTQ club?	No, he doesn't feel like he fits in, it seems to be a popularity thing to him. Most of his friends or social contacts are from the online gaming community.
The Prozac seems to be helping, do you get the sense that they may be willing to bump up the dose if need be?	Yes, he has recently shown that he is taking more control of his healthcare, there has been an increase in confidence with the Prozac, and moods seem improved as well.
Does he have any plans post graduation?	Unsure, he still has 1 more year of high school. The gender transition treatment has been the primary focus of visits.
Do you know what his priorities are? Have you asked directly?	Have not asked directly, but he has spoken a lot about hormone treatment and top surgery. Next f/u appointment is in May, will ask then.

KEY RECOMMENDATIONS:

Excellent Job sticking with this family. Keep working on the therapeutic relationship. You have seen this youth through several stages of development, which is so important. Especially since there is a lack of counselors specializing in transgender support.

<u>Maine Integrated Youth Health Study</u> (MIYHS) data shows that middle and high school students who identify as trans have doubled between 2019 and 2021. Yet, it is crucial for him to have a therapist that is competent in gender issues and will take some research.

 - Recommend the MaineTransNet Discord channel for community building, which may be especially relatable for this age group that already use <u>Discord</u> to communicate with their gaming friends.

Remain hopeful. Similar patients have been successful in getting top surgery.

- The process is lengthy and involves continuous follow through on appointments.
- o Includes getting letters of support from the pediatrician and counselor.

Trans masculine patients should be having the contraception discussion just as with cis female patients.

- We know that LGBTQ youth are at a higher risk of assault and involvement in non-consensual.
- o Re-visit menstrual suppression, or just contraception to prevent pregnancy.

Talk about school and priorities beyond surgery.

- Consider connecting with school. Get a release and determine what exactly is on the IEP or 504 plan.
- Consider alternative school options for this patient.

Offer options to ease transportation barriers.
